Dear members of the Joint Committee on Transportation,

I am writing to you to urge support for Senate Bill 574, Relating to vehicle filtering in traffic slowdowns. I have travelled in California on multiple occasions, for extended periods, on motorcycle. I have seen first hand how well implemented California's law on lane splitting and lane filtering is implemented in that state. I know the Oregon proposal is not the same, but it proposes a variation of the concept of lane splitting during traffic slowdowns. It takes only a moment for a car following a car length or two behind a motorcycle to create a tragic collision. A collision that tends to have far less consequences between two cars can become a maining or deadly incident when it is between a car and a motorcycle. California is a shining example of how lane splitting can become a safe and widely embraced concept in Oregon, given the opportunity and time. Please vote Yes to allow SB 574 to move forward.
