Identification and prioritization of possible adoptive resources

- Relatives & Current Caretakers
- 2. General Applicants

"Current caretaker" means a resource parent who:

(a) Is currently caring for a *child* in the care and custody of the Department and has a permanency plan or concurrent permanent plan of adoption; and

(b) Has cared for the *child* or at least one *sibling* of the *child* for at least 12 months or for one-half of the child's or sibling's life if the *child* or *sibling* is younger than two years of age. Time spent caring for the child or sibling under this definition is calculated cumulatively.

Adoption selection considerations

ORS 109.270

- ☐ Consider each adoptive parent and their ability to meet the individual needs
- □ Consider children's relatives and current caretaker as having equal status and priority
- Consider relatives and current caretakers before considering others

OAR 413-120-0700 to 413-120-0760

■ Best meet the current and lifelong needs of each child

Child placed with current caretaker who wants to be adoptive resource*




Caseworker consults supervisor, legal parties




Multiple families are considered

- Adoption Decision Specialist makes the adoption selection
