#### Work Session

SB 39

Amends definition of "practice of nursing." Changes deadline for renewal of nursing licenses and nurses' authority to prescribe.

SB 40

Requires clinical component in nursing education for licensure by indorsement.

SB 64

Creates exemption to prohibition on person under 21 years of age entering establishment where tobacco products or inhalant delivery systems are sold for purposes of investigating violations.

SB 65

Transfers duties, functions and powers related to COFA Premium Assistance Program and health insurance exchange from Department of Consumer and Business Services to Oregon Health Authority on June 30, 2021.

SB 70

Defines "regional health equity coalition" and "regional health equity coalition model." Requires Oregon Health Authority to work with regional health equity coalitions and groups utilizing regional health equity coalition model throughout state.

#### Public Hearing

SB 560

Requires insurer and health care service contractor to count payments made on behalf of enrollee for costs of care toward enrollee's out-of-pocket maximum or cost-sharing.

### **February 22, 2021**

SB 439

Requires insurer offering health plan, or person acting on behalf of insurer, to reduce enrollee cost sharing for prescription drugs by 85 percent of rebates received by insurer.

SB 457

Modifies required coverage of prescription drugs in medical assistance program.

SB 558

Prohibits insurance policy or contract that provides coverage for prescription drug to require prescription for drug to be filled or refilled at mail order pharmacy or to prohibit prescription from being filled or refilled at local pharmacy.

SB 711

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study cost differences in pharmaceuticals used primarily by men and pharmaceuticals used primarily by women and report findings to Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.
