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Measure Description:

Allows a physician assistant to dispense schedule I or II prescription drugs without a supervising physician or physician organization. Allows a physician assistant to delegate dispensing to a staff assistant if the prescription is verified for accuracy and completeness. Requires a physician assistant to maintain records of the dispensed prescription, adhere to labeling requirements. Grants the Oregon Medical Board disciplinary authority over a physician assistant with dispensing authority. Allows a physician assistant to dispense schedule II through IV prescription drugs without a supervising physician or physician organization if registered with the Oregon Medical Board.
