

SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

HB 3265 Relating to immigration

The primary provisions of HB 3265 include:

- Prohibiting a law enforcement agency or a public body from denying services, benefits, privileges, or opportunities to an individual in custody, or on parole, probation, or post-prison supervision, on the basis of known or suspected immigration status, the existence of an immigration detainer, hold, notification, or other related federal immigration request or a civil immigration warrant.
- Limiting the authority of law enforcement to inquire into an individual’s immigration or citizenship status without connection to a criminal investigation or from providing information about an individual in custody to federal immigration authority, and other specified circumstances.
- Prohibiting the use of public resources to assist in federal immigration enforcement.
- Requiring a public body to decline any request or communication for assistance from a federal immigration authority and to report the request or communication to the director or similar management personnel of the public body, among other statutory changes.

HB 3265 appropriates \$905,071 General Fund to the Department of Justice to implement the measure.

The Public Safety Subcommittee recommends HB 3265 be amended by the –A4 amendment and be reported out do pass, as amended.
