HB 4003 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon State Board of Nursing to issue nurse internship license to qualified applicant.

HB 4034

Deletes requirement that coordinated care organization collect specified data from members and submit data to Oregon Health Authority.

HB 4035

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations for options to improve access to or lower cost of health care in Oregon.

HB 4109

Directs Newborn Bloodspot Screening Advisory Board to evaluate and make recommendations on adding diseases to Oregon newborn bloodspot screening panel under specific circumstances.

HB 4052 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide grants to operate two culturally and linguistically specific mobile health units, as pilot program, to serve priority populations with histories of poor health or social outcomes.

HB 4045 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Directs Oregon Health Authority to establish grant programs related to community violence prevention.

HB 4081

Requires pharmacist who dispenses opioid prescription to offer prescription for naloxone, or similar drug, and information about naloxone under specified circumstances.

HB 4083

Requires individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors, multiple employer welfare arrangements and state medical assistance program to provide reimbursement for at least three primary care visits annually in addition to one annual preventive primary care visit covered without cost-sharing.

HB 4134

Requires insurer and health care service contractor to cover labor and delivery services provided at out-of-network health care facility if services provided at out-of-network facility due solely to diversion of patient from in-network health care facility for reasons related to state or federal declaration of public health emergency.

HB 4095 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes Veterans Dental Program in Oregon Health Authority to provide oral health care to low-income veterans who reside in Oregon beginning in 2023.

HB 4101

Increases distance from certain parts of public places and places of employment within which person may not smoke, aerosolize or vaporize inhalant from 10 feet to 25 feet.

HB 4006

Requires individual and group health insurance policies to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within scope of their practice if services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians.

HB 4096

Authorizes health care practitioner authorized in another state or United States territory to practice in this state without compensation for specified number of days without obtaining licensure in this state.

HB 4038 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Creates crime of false representation in assisted reproduction.

HB 4039 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Modifies financial requirements for coordinated care organization expenditures on social determinants of health and health equity.

HB 4132 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to meet monthly with specified health care providers to discuss providers' concerns regarding insurer practices.
