HB 4133

(8:05 am) Requires electronic voter registration system to allow qualified individual to register to vote if individual has Social Security number.

HB 4044

(8:25 am) Reduces number of electors who must be registered as member of minor political party in order for minor political party to retain political party status from one-half of one percent to one-quarter of one percent of total number of registered electors in state.

HB 4027

Limits local government regulations on certain nonresidential alarm systems and battery-charged fences.

HB 4087

Requires, on or after January 1, 2023, officials of public bodies to grant news media representatives access to scenes of wildfires or natural disasters on public lands that are otherwise closed to public.
