SB 1556 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires Department of Human Services to establish certification process for direct care providers of home- or community-based services and implement online registry of direct care providers of home- or community-based services. SB 1548

Requires Department of Human Services to allow specified individuals receiving home- and community-based care to receive agency with choice services to perform employment-related functions with respect to workers employed by individuals to provide in-home care and services.

SB 1547 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires operators, employees and certain volunteers of preschool recorded programs and schoolage recorded programs to be enrolled in Central Background Registry.
