SB 1510 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires police officer to inform stopped person of right to refuse consent to search.

SB 1511 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Creates process by which person convicted or found guilty except for insanity as result of nonunanimous jury verdict may file petition for post-conviction relief within one year of effective date of Act.

SB 1512

Specifies conditions under which licensing board, commission or agency may suspend or deny occupational or professional license on basis of applicant's or licensee's criminal history, moral character or similar qualification.
