SB 1543 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Provides for nonprofit organization that addresses and executes worker relief to serve as fiscal agent to award grants to organizations to provide services related to immigration matters through universal representation program.

SB 1560

Updates statutory references to individual who is not citizen or national of United States to replace "alien" with "noncitizen."

Directs state agencies to use "noncitizen" in rules and regulations to reference individual who is not citizen or national of United States and to update rules and regulations that use "alien" to use "noncitizen."

Makes nonsubstantive changes.

SB 1574

Includes in definition of sexual assault forensic evidence kit chart prepared by sexual assault nurse examiner for purposes of statutes regulating collection, testing and retention of kits.
