SB 1543 \*\*

Provides for nonprofit organization that addresses and executes worker relief to serve as fiscal agent to award grants to organizations to provide services related to immigration matters through universal representation program.

SB 1560

Updates statutory references to individual who is not citizen or national of United States to replace "alien" with "noncitizen."

Directs state agencies to use "noncitizen" in rules and regulations to reference individual who is not citizen or national of United States and to update rules and regulations that use "alien" to

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use "noncitizen."

Makes nonsubstantive changes.

SB 1574

Includes in definition of sexual assault forensic evidence kit chart prepared by sexual assault nurse examiner for purposes of statutes regulating collection, testing and retention of kits.

SB 1568 \*\*

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-9-2022 MEETING: Establishes Medical Release Advisory Committee within State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.

SB 1511 \*\*

\*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-9-2022 MEETING: Creates process by which person convicted or found guilty except for insanity as result of nonunanimous jury verdict may file petition for post-conviction relief within one year of effective date of Act.

SB 1512

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2-9-2022 MEETING: Specifies conditions under which licensing board, commission or agency may suspend or deny occupational or professional license on basis of applicant's or licensee's criminal history, moral character or similar qualification.
