SB 1545 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Establishes grant programs in Higher Education Coordinating Commission to provide funding for workforce development activities that aim to increase access for priority populations to training opportunities in construction, health care and manufacturing and to workforce development services and benefits.

Please note: SB 1504 is scheduled solely for the purpose of referral to a different committee without recommendation.

Work Session

SB 1504

Prohibits accepting wagers or providing gambling services in connection with greyhound racing.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

SB 1515

Modifies definition of "benefit year" for purposes of paid family and medical leave insurance program.

SB 1586

Clarifies prohibitions regarding provisions that may not be included in agreements between employers and former, current or prospective employees.

AGENDA (cont.) February 3, 2022

SB 1513

Prohibits employer from taking adverse employment action against employee employed in certain manufacturing establishments who refuses to work mandatory overtime shift unless employer has provided employee with at least two weeks' advance notice of overtime shift.

SB 1585

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services and Oregon Health Authority to enter into intergovernmental agreement for disclosure of data related to outbreak of COVID-19 in workplaces to enable department to inform beneficiaries of rights to workers' compensation death benefits.

SB 1505

Requires person that produces intercollegiate sports team jersey, video game or trading card for profit to make royalty payment to student athlete for use of student athlete's name, image or likeness.
