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HB5024 - Infrastructure Investments Update

Initial Request for Proposals:

- For “ready to go” Projects
- These priority populations include the Civil Commit, Aid and Assist, GEI, and Children’ with severe emotional and behavioral challenges
- Licensed levels of care including children’s psychiatric residential treatment, and adult mental health residential
- Priority for intensive treatment services focused on children or people ready to be discharged (or diverted) from Oregon State Hospital
- Projects to be ready to admit residents within 12 months
- **RFP Closed 02/14/22**

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Summary of Initial Request for Proposals:

- Bids are being prepared for formal scoring committee review - much remains confidential
- 12 proposals were submitted by 11 vendors
- Proposals would open 193 Beds total

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Summary of Initial Request for Proposals:

- **141 beds for children's facility or home**

- 16 beds - Portland, Multnomah County

- 32 beds – Canyonville, Douglas County

- 12 beds – Eugene, Lane County

- 60 beds – Corvallis, Benton County

- 21 beds – Portland, Multnomah County

- **52 beds for adults' facility or home**

- 16 beds – Central Point, Jackson County

- 15 beds – Eugene, Lane County

- 11 beds – Hillsboro, Washington

- 5 beds – Portland, Multnomah County
