Timeline

2020

Sept

- Incident period begins
- Emergency Declared

Nov

- Direct housing mission approved
- HUD activated
- First occupant moved into Direct Housing site

2021

Jan

- Debris cleanup transitioned to phase two

Apr

- Local long-term recovery groups established in affected counties

Jul - Aug

- IA Re-engagement

2022

Sept - Oct

- Public Assistance 100% cost share (30 day timeframe)

Dec

- Direct Housing extension approved

Mar

- Hazard Mitigation Subapplications due to FEMA

Jun

- Re-assess Direct Housing for extension

Sept

- Current Direct Housing extension ends

Extension

- Requested by the state, granted by FEMA
Sept. 15, 2022
- Re-assess June 2022

Rent

- Notifications delivered
Jan 15, 2022
- Rent collection begins
April 1, 2022
- Income adjustments
- Appeals process

Sales & Donations

- Eligibility
- 69 eligible applicants
- 34 in final-offer process

By the Numbers

Households in Direct Housing: 188

Individual Assistance Registrants: 25,251

Individual Assistance Amount Approved: \$39.9M

Public Assistance Obligated to Date: \$339 million

Mitigation Programs

406 Mitigation

- Staffing – 60% local
- 406 projects = \$9.9 million

Hazard Mitigation (HMGP)

State Cost Share

- 75/25 split
- \$96 million federal
- \$20 million state cost share assistance
