Measure Description:

Increases the distance from certain parts of public places and places of employment within which person may not smoke, aerosolize, or vaporize inhalant from 10 feet to 25 feet. Allows a person to smoke, aerosolize, or vaporize an inhalant within 25 feet, but not closer than 10 feet, of a public place or place of employment that holds a license issued by the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.
