Measure Description:

Corrects a statutory reference from "return identification envelope" to "secrecy envelope." Directs the Secretary of State to ensure that county elections officials conduct election recounts, for certain specified elections, in a manner that is consistent, transparent, accurate and in accordance with all applicable laws. Reduces the number of electors who must be registered as a member of a minor political party in order for a minor political party to retain political party status from one-half of one percent to one-quarter of one percent of the total number of registered voters in the state.
