

B-Engrossed House Bill 4072

Ordered by the House February 24
Including House Amendments dated February 15 and February 24

Sponsored by Representatives GOMBERG, SMITH DB; Representative WEBER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Eliminates one-day angling license. Reduces maximum current and future one-day angling and shellfish license fee established in fee schedule.

Provides for temporary partial dedication of one-day angling and shellfish license fee to Oregon Hatchery Research Center Fund.

Authorizes State Fish and Wildlife Commission to issue Rogue-South Coast steelhead validation and Rogue-South Coast wild steelhead harvest card. Instructs commission to adopt rules related to validation and harvest card. Provides that moneys received from sale of validation and harvest card shall be credited to Rogue-South Coast Research and Monitoring Subaccount.

Establishes Rogue-South Coast Research and Monitoring Subaccount in Fish and Wildlife Account. Provides that moneys in subaccount shall be used for certain research and monitoring.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to authorizations issued by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission; amending ORS 496.303, 497.061, 497.121, 497.124, 497.126 and 497.138 and section 3, chapter 734, Oregon Laws 2015.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 497.061 is amended to read:

497.061. (1) Except as otherwise provided [*for*] by law, the State Fish and Wildlife Commission shall charge the fees listed in the fee schedule under this section for the issuance of the specified licenses, tags and permits.

497.121. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Commission *[is authorized to issue, upon application,]* **may, upon application and payment of the applicable fees established by the fee schedule under ORS 497.061, issue the following licenses and tags** to persons desiring to angle for fish or take shellfish *[the following licenses and tags and shall charge the applicable fees under the fee schedule in ORS 497.061]:*

- (a) Resident annual angling license.
- (b) Nonresident annual angling license.
- (c) Nonresident angling license to angle for seven consecutive days.
- [(d) Angling license to angle for one day.]*
- [(e)]* (d) Angling and shellfish license to angle and take shellfish for one day.
- [(f)]* (e) Angling license to angle for two days.
- [(g)]* (f) Angling license to angle for three days.
- [(h)]* (g) Resident annual shellfish license.
- [(i)]* (h) Nonresident annual shellfish license.
- [(j)]* (i) Nonresident three-day shellfish license.

1 [(k)] (j) Two rod angling license for anglers who also hold a valid annual angling license.

2 [(L)] (k) Resident annual senior citizen angling license for persons 70 years of age or older who
3 have resided in the state for not less than five years prior to the date of application.

4 [(m)] (L) Resident disabled veteran angling license for a person who files with the commission
5 written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Department of Vet-
6 erans Affairs or by any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States shows the person to be
7 at least 25 percent disabled.

8 [(n)] (m) Resident disabled veteran shellfish license for a person who files with the commission
9 written proof that the last official certification of record by the United States Department of Vet-

7 496.303. (1) The Fish and Wildlife Account is established in the State Treasury, separate and
8 distinct from the General Fund. All moneys in the account are continuously appropriated to the
9 State Fish and Wildlife Commission. The Fish and Wildlife Account shall consist of the moneys in
10 its various subaccounts and any moneys transferred to the account by the Legislative Assembly.
11 Unless otherwise specified by law, interest earnings on moneys in the account shall be paid into the
12 State Treasury and credited to the State Wildlife Fund.

13 (2)(a) The Fish Screening Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. The sub-
14 account shall consist of:

15 (A) All penalties recovered under ORS 536.900 to 536.920.

16 (B) All moneys received pursuant to ORS 498.306.

17 (C) All gifts, grants and other moneys from whatever source that may be used to carry out the

27 expense of maintaining fish hatcheries operated by the department.

28 (4) The Migratory Waterfowl Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. All
29 moneys received by the commission from the sale of art works and prints related to the migratory
30 waterfowl stamps shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended
31 only for activities that promote the propagation, conservation and recreational uses of migratory
32 waterfowl and for activities related to the design, production, issuance and arrangements for sale
33 of the migratory waterfowl stamps and related art works and prints. Expenditures of moneys in the
34 subaccount may be made within this state, in other states or in foreign countries, in such amounts
35 as the commission determines appropriate. Expenditures in other states and foreign countries shall
36 be on such terms and conditions as the commission determines will benefit most directly the mi-
37 gratory waterfowl resources of this state.

38 (5) The Halibut Research Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. Based on
39 the annual number of recreational halibut anglers, a portion of the moneys derived from the sale
40 of the salmon, steelhead trout, sturgeon and halibut tag pursuant to ORS 497.121 shall be credited
41 to the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only for halibut population studies
42 and other research.

43 (6) The Upland Bird Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. All moneys
44 received by the State Fish and Wildlife Commission from the sale of upland bird stamps, from the
45 sale of any art works and prints related to the upland bird stamps and from private hunting preserve

1 permit fees shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only
2 for promoting the propagation and conservation of upland birds and the acquisition, development,
3 management, enhancement, sale or exchange of upland bird habitat, and for activities related to the
4 design, production, issuance and arrangements for sale of the upland bird stamps and related art
5 works and prints. Expenditures of moneys in the subaccount shall be made for the benefit of pro-
6 grams within this state in such amounts and at such times as the commission determines appropriate
7 to most directly benefit the upland bird resources of the state.

8 (7) The Access and Habitat Board Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account.
9 The subaccount shall consist of moneys transferred to the subaccount pursuant to ORS 496.242.
10 Moneys in the subaccount may be used for the purposes specified in ORS 496.242.

11 (8) The Marine Shellfish Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account. Interest
12 earnings on moneys in the subaccount shall be credited to the subaccount. All moneys received by
13 the commission from the sale of resident and nonresident shellfish licenses pursuant to ORS 497.121
14 shall be deposited in the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the protection and
15 enhancement of shellfish for recreational purposes, including shellfish sanitation costs and the cost
16 of enforcement of wildlife laws pertaining to the taking of shellfish. The State Fish and Wildlife
17 Director, or a designee, the Director of Agriculture, or a designee, and the Superintendent of State
18 Police, or a designee, shall jointly make a recommendation to the Governor for inclusion in the
19 Governor's budget beginning July 1 of each odd-numbered year.

20 (9)(a) The Mountain Sheep Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consist-
21 ing of moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

22 (b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of mountain
23 sheep, for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of mountain
24 sheep habitat and for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most di-
25 rectly benefit mountain sheep resources of this state.

26 (10)(a) The Antelope Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consisting of
27 moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

28 (b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of antelope,
29 for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of antelope habitat and
30 for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most directly benefit antelope
31 resources of this state.

32 (11)(a) The Mountain Goat Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Account, consist-
33 ing of moneys collected under ORS 497.112 (2)(a) to (c).

34 (b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for the propagation and conservation of mountain
35 goats for research, development, management, enhancement and sale or exchange of mountain goat
36 habitat and for programs within the state that in the discretion of the commission most directly
37 benefit mountain goat resources of this state.

38 (12) The commission shall keep a record of all moneys deposited in the Fish and Wildlife Ac-
39 count. The record shall indicate by separate cumulative accounts the sources from which the mon-
40 eys are derived and the individual activity or programs against which each withdrawal is charged.

41 (13) The Oregon Conservation Strategy Subaccount is established in the Fish and Wildlife Ac-
42 count. All moneys received by the commission from the sale of habitat conservation stamps and from
43 the sale of any art works and prints related to the habitat conservation stamp shall be deposited in
44 the subaccount. Moneys in the subaccount may be expended only to promote and implement habitat
45 and species restoration, enhancement and viewing activities identified in the "Oregon Conservation

1 Strategy,” 2006, by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife, and for activities related to the de-
2 sign, production, issuance and arrangements for sale of the habitat conservation stamps and related
3 art works and prints.

4 **(14)(a) The Rogue-South Coast Research and Monitoring Subaccount is established in the**
5 **Fish and Wildlife Account, consisting of moneys collected under ORS 497.121 (1)(r) and (s).**

6 **(b) All moneys in the subaccount shall be used for research and monitoring that is con-**
7 **sistent with the Rogue-South Coast Multi-Species Conservation and Management Plan the**
8 **commission adopted in December 2021, as subsequently amended by the commission.**

9 **(c) The commission may amend the plan as needed.**

10 **(d) The commission shall make the current version of the plan publicly available on a**
11 **website of the commission or of the State Department of Fish and Wildlife.**

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
