3 gency.”.

5 “**SECTION 1.** Section 1, chapter 659, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to read:

6 “**Sec. 1.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are estab-
7 lished for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses
8 from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds
9 and federal funds, collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and
10 the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and
11 facilities:

38 “**SECTION 2.** Section 3, chapter 659, Oregon Laws 2021, is amended to read:

39 “**Sec. 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of [~~\$445,905,100~~
40 **\$475,905,100** is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for
41 payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but
42 excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordi-
43 nating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued for the benefit of a public
44 university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and a public university.

45 “**SECTION 3.** In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appro-

1 **priated to the Legislative Administration Committee, for a six-year period beginning July 1,**
2 **2021, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$223,081,000, for the third phase of the Oregon**
3 **State Capitol Accessibility, Maintenance and Safety capital improvements.**

4 **“SECTION 4. The Legislative Assembly approves the proposal of the Oregon Military**
5 **Department, submitted in accordance with ORS 396.515 (4), for the sale of the Silverton Ar-**
6 **mory.**

7 **“SECTION 5. This 2022 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
8 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2022 Act takes effect**
9 **on its passage.”.**

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
