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PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1530

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the rest of the line and delete line 2 and insert "and declaring an emergency.".
- Delete lines 15 though 27 and delete pages 2 through 6 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority, in collaboration with the Department of Consumer and Business Services, shall study access to fertility and reproductive endocrinology services by residents of this state, including:
- 8 "(a) Availability and utilization of fertility and reproductive 9 endocrinology services in the commercial health insurance markets, 10 self-insured health plans and the state medical assistance program;
 - "(b) Financial and access barriers to obtaining fertility and reproductive endocrinology services including assisted reproductive technology; and
 - "(c) Inequities in access to fertility and reproductive endocrinology services based on race, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, income, marital status, immigration status and disability.
- "(2) The authority shall provide a preliminary report no later than
 October 31, 2022, and a final report no later than December 1, 2022, to
 the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health,
 in the manner provided in ORS 192.245, containing the findings of the
 study described in subsection (1) of this section and recommendations

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- "(a) Reducing financial and access barriers to fertility and reproductive endocrinology services for residents of this state;
- "(b) Strategies to promote equal access to fertility and reproductive 4 endocrinology services, including protections against discrimination in the provision of fertility and reproductive endocrinology services;
 - "(c) A plan to provide equitable access to assisted reproductive technology for all residents of this state;
 - "(d) The feasibility of obtaining federal financial participation in or other federal resources to support the plan described in paragraph (c) of this subsection; and
 - "(e) Legislative changes necessary to implement the recommendations under this subsection.

"SECTION 2. This 2022 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2022 Act takes effect on its passage.".

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
