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## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4118

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "housing" insert "; and prescribing an effective date".
- Delete lines 4 through 31 and delete page 2 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Barriers to Housing, Industrial and Manufacturing Development is established.
- 6 "(2) The task force consists of 31 members appointed as follows:
- 7 "(a) The President of the Senate, in consultation with the Senate 8 Minority Leader, shall appoint members as follows:
- 9 "(A) Two members from the Senate, from different political parties;
- 10 "(B) One member who represents state or regional land use plan-11 ning organizations;
- "(C) One member who represents property owners seeking to develop property;
- "(D) One member who represents an organization dedicated to building homes for owner occupancy for families at or below the median family income level;
- "(E) One member who represents an organization representing businesses seeking additional opportunities for industrial land development;
- 20 "(F) One member who represents an association of Oregon cities;
  - "(G) One member who represents a city in the Rogue Valley with

a population greater than 80,000;

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- "(H) One member who represents a city with a population less than 3,000 and with natural hazards imposing development limitations on a 4 significant portion of land within the acknowledged urban growth 5 boundary;
- "(I) One member who represents a city on the Oregon coast with a population greater than 10,000 and with a demonstrated lack of affordable housing;
- 9 "(J) One member who represents a city in eastern Oregon with a 10 population greater than 10,000;
- 11 "(K) One member who represents a city in Multnomah County with 12 a population greater than 100,000 and with a need for industrial land; 13 and
  - "(L) One member who represents a city in the Willamette Valley with a population less than 5,000 and with an acknowledged urban growth boundary with significant areas of undeveloped land consisting predominantly of hydric soils;
  - "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, in consultation with the House Minority Leader, shall appoint members as follows:
  - "(A) Two members from the House of Representatives, from different political parties;
    - "(B) One member who represents the homebuilding industry;
- "(C) One member who represents an organization seeking affordable housing opportunities for members of historically disadvantaged communities;
- 26 "(D) One member who represents an association of Oregon coun-27 ties;
- 28 "(E) One member who represents the real estate industry;
- 29 "(F) One member who represents a tribal economic development 30 organization;

- "(G) One member who represents a building trade organization;
- "(H) One member who represents a city in Washington County with a population exceeding 100,000 and with a need for industrial land;
- "(I) One member who represents a city with a population greater than 3,000 and with natural hazards imposing development limitations on a significant portion of land within the acknowledged urban growth boundary;
- "(J) One member who represents a city on the Oregon coast with a population less than 10,000 and with a demonstrated lack of affordable housing;
  - "(K) One member who represents a city in eastern Oregon with a population less than 10,000;
  - "(L) One member who represents a city in the Willamette Valley with a population greater than 5,000 that has attempted to expand its acknowledged urban growth boundary on or after January 1, 2017; and
- 16 "(M) One member who represents a city in Deschutes County with 17 a population greater than 30,000;
  - "(c) The Director of the Department of Land Conservation and Development, or a designee of the director;
- 20 "(d) The Director of the Department of State Lands, or a designee 21 of the director;
- "(e) The Director of the Housing and Community Services Department, or a designee of the director; and
- 24 "(f) The president of a council of a metropolitan service district, 25 or a designee of the president.
- 26 "(3) The task force shall consider:
- "(a) Barriers in ORS chapters 195, 196, 197 and 227 and agency rules to the timely provision of needed housing and shovel-ready industrial and manufacturing land to support needed housing;
  - "(b) The impact of expansion of the urban growth boundary on

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- homeownership rates, housing prices, including rental housing, the 1 provision of adequate land for large-scale industrial or manufacturing 2
- development, and natural resource industries; 3

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- "(c) The impact of land use policies designed to increase housing 4 densities within the urban growth boundary on homeownership rates, 5 housing prices, including rental housing, loss of land for commercial, 6 manufacturing and industrial uses, neighborhood livability and 7 gentrification; 8
- "(d) Barriers to homeownership for members of historically disad-9 vantaged communities and households with incomes at or below the area median income;
  - "(e) Types of infrastructure that are necessary for needed housing and shovel-ready industrial land, and methods to reduce the cost of that needed infrastructure, including state funding and tax abatement for infrastructure investments; and
- "(f) Additions or amendments to state law or agency rules to in-16 crease the timely production of needed housing and availability of 17 sufficient land for large-scale industrial and manufacturing develop-18 19 ment.
- "(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a 20 quorum for the transaction of business. 21
- "(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a 22 majority of the members of the task force. 23
- "(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as 24 chairperson. 25
- "(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority 26 shall make an appointment to become effective immediately. 27
- "(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 28 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task 29 force. 30

- "(9) The task force may adopt rules as necessary for the operation of the task force.
- "(10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and shall include initial findings and recommendations for legislation, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing no later than December 31, 2022.
- "(11) The Legislative Policy and Research Committee shall provide
  staff support to the task force.
  - "(12) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.
  - "(13) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.
  - "(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties of the task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
- "SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2022 Act is repealed December 31, 2022.
  - "SECTION 3. This 2022 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2022 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.".

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
