**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
SENATE BILL 1506**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 29 and delete page  
2 2 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 475C.453 is amended to read:

4 “475C.453. (1)(a) Except as expressly authorized by this section, the au-  
5 thority to impose a tax or fee on the production, processing or sale of  
6 marijuana items in this state is vested solely in the Legislative Assembly.

7 “(b) Except as expressly authorized by this section, a county, city or other  
8 municipal corporation or district may not adopt or enact ordinances impos-  
9 ing a tax or fee on the production, processing or sale of marijuana items in  
10 this state.

11 “(2) Subject to [*subsection (4)*] **subsections (4) and (5)** of this section, the  
12 governing body of a city or county may adopt an ordinance to be referred  
13 to the electors of the city or county as described in subsection (3) of this  
14 section that imposes a tax or a fee on the sale of marijuana items that are  
15 sold in the area subject to the jurisdiction of the city or the unincorporated  
16 area subject to the jurisdiction of a county by a marijuana retailer that  
17 holds a license issued under ORS 475C.097.

18 “(3) If the governing body of a city or county adopts an ordinance under  
19 this section, the governing body shall refer the measure of the ordinance to  
20 the electors of the city or county for approval at the next statewide general  
21 election.

1       “(4) An ordinance adopted under this section may not impose a tax or fee:

2       “(a) **Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section**, in excess of  
3 three percent; or

4       “(b) On a registry identification cardholder or on a designated primary  
5 caregiver who is purchasing a marijuana item for a registry identification  
6 cardholder.

7       “(5) **The governing body of a city may by ordinance impose a tax**  
8 **or fee not in excess of 10 percent if the city is located in a county that:**

9       “(a) **Is bordered by a neighboring state in which marijuana items**  
10 **may not be lawfully sold; and**

11       “(b) **Has a population exceeding 30,000 in the most recent federal**  
12 **decennial census.**

13       “**SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 475C.453 by section 1 of this**  
14 **2022 Act apply to marijuana items produced, processed or sold on or**  
15 **after January 1, 2023.**

16       “**SECTION 3. This 2022 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**  
17 **date on which the 2022 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative**  
18 **Assembly adjourns sine die.”.**

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
