PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 1529

- On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 3, after "401.667" insert ",
- 2 431.035, 431.045".
- 3 Delete lines 11 through 16 and insert:
- 4 "(1) 'Health care emergency' means:
- 5 "(a) A state of public health emergency declared under ORS 433.441; or
- 6 "(b) An emergency declared under section 15 of this 2022 Act.".
- 7 On page 5, after line 18, insert:
- 8 **"SECTION 10.** ORS 431.035 is amended to read:
- 9 "431.035. (1) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority may delegate
- to any of the officers and employees of the Oregon Health Authority the
- exercise or discharge in the director's name of any power, duty or function
- of whatever character vested in or imposed upon the director by the laws
- of Oregon. However, the power to administer oaths and affirmations,
- subpoena witnesses, take evidence and require the production of books, pa-
- pers, correspondence, memoranda, agreements or other documents or records
- 16 may be exercised by an officer or employee of the authority only when spe-
- 17 cifically delegated in writing by the director.
- 18 "(2) The official act of any such person so acting in the director's name
- and by the authority of the director shall be deemed to be an official act of
- 20 the director.
- 21 "(3)(a) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall appoint a

- 1 Public Health Director to perform the duties and exercise authority over
- 2 public health emergency matters in the state and other duties as assigned
- 3 by the director. The director may appoint the same person to serve as both
- 4 the Public Health Director and the Public Health Officer appointed under
- 5 ORS 431.045.
- 6 "(b) The Public Health Director shall be an assistant director appointed
- 7 by the Director of the Oregon Health Authority in accordance with ORS
- 8 409.130. The appointment of the Public Health Director is subject to
- 9 confirmation by the Senate in the manner provided by ORS 171.562 and
- 10 **171.565.**

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- "(c) The Public Health Director shall delegate to an employee of the au-
- 12 thority the duties, powers and functions granted to the Public Health Di-
- 13 rector by ORS 431A.015 and 433.443 in the event of the absence from the state
- or the unavailability of the director. The delegation must be in writing.
- 15 "(d) The Public Health Director shall hold a master's degree or
- 16 equivalent in public health or health care management and shall have
- 17 at least 10 years of experience working in clinical health or public
- 18 health management.
 - **"SECTION 11.** ORS 431.045 is amended to read:
- 20 "431.045. (1) The Director of the Oregon Health Authority shall appoint
- 21 a Public Health Officer who shall be responsible for the medical and
- 22 paramedical aspects of the health programs within the Oregon Health Au-
- 23 thority. The Public Health Officer must be a physician licensed under ORS
- 24 chapter 677 who:
- 25 "(a) Is certified by the American Board of Preventive Medicine or the
- 26 board of a primary care clinical specialty such as internal medicine, family
- 27 medicine or pediatrics; and
- 28 "(b) Has at least two years of experience working for a local, state or
- 29 federal public health authority.
 - "(2) The Public Health Officer:

- "(a) Is responsible for the duties imposed by 42 U.S.C. 300ff-133(g) and 300ff-136;
- "(b) May appoint a local health officer for a county that has transferred the responsibility of the local public health authority in the county to the
- 5 Oregon Health Authority under ORS 431.382; and
- 6 "(c) May adopt rules to carry out the officer's responsibilities under this subsection.
- "(3) If the Public Health Officer serves as a state epidemiologist, the
 Public Health Officer shall hold a master's degree or equivalent in
 epidemiology and have at least five years of experience practicing as
 an epidemiologist.
- "SECTION 12. The amendments to ORS 431.035 and 431.045 by sections 10 and 11 of this 2022 Act apply to the candidates next appointed to the positions of Public Health Director and Public Health Officer following the effective date of this 2022 Act."
- In line 19, delete "10" and insert "13".
- On page 6, after line 32, insert:
- 18 "SECTION 14. Section 15 of this 2022 Act is added to and made a 19 part of ORS 401.651 to 401.670.
- "SECTION 15. (1) The Governor, without approval of the Legislative
 Assembly, may declare a health care emergency for a period not to
 exceed 30 days.
- "(2)(a) Within 14 days of the date of the declaration described in subsection (1) of this section, the declaration may be extended to 60 days from the date of the declaration if the Legislative Assembly approves of the extension by a vote of two-thirds of the members of each house.
- "(b) If, following the extension described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, the circumstances creating the emergency continue to exist, the declaration described in subsection (1) of this section may be

- extended in 60-days periods if the Legislative Assembly approves of each extension by a vote of two-thirds of the members of each house.
- "(3) The Public Health Director shall submit a report to the presiding officers of the Legislative Assembly every seven days while a declaration described in subsection (1) of this section and any extension under subsection (2) of this section is in effect. The reports made under this subsection must include information on any public health emergency actions taken.
- 9 "(4) A report made under subsection (3) of this section is subject to 10 public disclosure under ORS 192.311 to 192.478.".
