Providence recognizes that long-standing inequities and systemic injustices have led to health disparities in communities across Oregon. We are proud to voice our support for House Bill 4052, legislation that begins to identify and correct systems and structures that perpetuate inequity and lead to health disparities.

Our support for House Bill 4052 is based on evidence that racism leads to measurable and detrimental outcomes in an individual's health and well-being. Providence supports three components of this legislation that promotes equitable access to services and moves this work forward in a tangible way.
