Thank you for the opportunity to share my support for House Bill 4099, establishing the Racial Equity and Justice Youth Collaborative. I currently serve as the State Senator for Senate District 15 in Western Washington County. During my eight years on the Hillsboro School Board I advocated to bring student representation to the board. I'm proud to say that Hillsboro School Board now has three student representatives, that serve one-year terms each, with new students coming on board each year.
