Proven science is already reflected in the Forest Practices Act which adapts over time and with proven science regarding sustainability, forest health, waterways, roads, wildlife, etc. Private timberlands are more resilient and healthier than public timberland, as seen in the wildfires. Over 80% of wildfires are on public lands.
