RE: Senate Bill 1534 Increasing Carbon Sequestration on Oregon's Natural and Working Lands

Chair Gordon and committee members:

The Clackamas Soil and Water Conservation District (CSWCD) is a local government organization that serves citizens located in Clackamas County, Oregon. The mission of CSWCD is to support conservation of natural resources through a variety of efforts ranging from education to implementing on-the-ground projects. We provide technical services and support funding to landowners to improve land conditions.

The District wants to lend its support to SB 1534, the bill sets up a framework for state policy to increase carbon sequestration in natural and working lands and waters. The bill is embedded in the approach of voluntary stewardship of our natural and working lands which gives Soil and Water Conservation Districts the platform to collaborate directly with farmers, ranchers, foresters, and entire communities to contribute to climate change mitigation. Our strengths reside in community education and engagement which allows us to provide technical assistance to landowners in a non-regulatory fashion that results in implementation of successful conservation practices.
