Dear Representatives,

I am opposed to HB 4133 for the following reasons:

1 There is nothing in the bill to verify that a social security number is valid. There is no

coordination with the federal government to verify that the person is a resident of Oregon or that

the person is of legal voting age.

2. Social Security numbers are not supposed to used for identification but only for Social

Security Benefits. Medicare cards were using SS numbers for medicare benefits but was changed

to create a completely new identification number as fraud became rampant.

3 Using a Social Security number would make the voter system a prime target for hackers to get

information in one location for identity fraud and possible harm to the voter roles of qualified

persons.

4 Creating a third party system for gathering electronic signatures adds to the possibility of fraud

by placing multiple signatures of potential voters into the hands of a third party. The wording

says that the third party would submit the requests for others. The potential voter needs to submit

their own request and not put the information in the hands of others. There are no qualifications

for these third parties to show their qualifications to represent others. There is no power of

attorney given to represent another individual. The question of one person one vote is

jeopardized by inserting a third party into the voting system.

I implore you to stop this proposal now before any further action is taken that would harm

election integrity.
