RE: House Bill 4101 - Increasing protections from secondhand smoke

Dear Chair Prusak and members of the committee:

Providence would like to express our support of House Bill 4101. As Oregon's largest health care provider and a leader in advanced cardiovascular care, Providence serves thousands of patients diagnosed with heart disease and stroke every year. In conjunction with effective medical intervention, Providence has implemented community-based prevention programs focused on strategies that support overall well-being, increased activity, and improved nutrition.

Despite impressive advances in the treatment of cardiac problems, the single most powerful weapon in the fight against heart disease is prevention. Heart disease remains the leading cause of death in the U.S. for both men and women and, left unchecked, it will continue to take an enormous human and financial toll.

With estimates that 80 percent of heart disease is avoidable through lifestyle changes, Providence is committed to supporting public policies, like House Bill 4101, that reduce public exposure to unhealthy environmental conditions and promote broader social change.
