Dairy Farming is not a 9 to 5 operation at all, in fact dairy farming is an 24/7 operation with husbandry ethics.

Exceptions to generally scheduled hours to name a few are:

- 1. Power outages affects: barn lighting, auto-milkers machines present, manual electric milkers, gutter flushing systems, feed dispensers,
- 2. Unscheduled in-climate weathers, and scheduled specialist workers during non-field work times.
- 3. On the job equipment break downs: tractors, mowers, green chop machines, tire mishaps, manure spreaders, CAFO liquid manure extraction systems and land distribution equipment above normal maintenance.
- 4. Scheduled worker emergencies and worker no-shows. Possibly COVID-19 and other epidemic impacts with a limited worker availability listing..
- 5. On the job accidents affecting mandatory operations.
- 6. Unusual events such as farm flooding.
- 7. Farm animal birthing problems.
- 8.Late special product deliveries, including feeds.
- 9.Unscheduled fencing repairs due to elk, fishermen, cattle pressure, and other reasons; with timely dairy animal search, rescue, and return..
- 10. Untimely water availability shortages.
- 11. Storm damages impacting a myriad of daily operations.
- 12. Small levee breaches and erosions.

In support of normalized dairy farming I oppose HB 4002 without such exceptions wherein farmer and farm worker can make agreeable compensation agreements less a formalized overtime system which could and will lead to numerous lawsuits; all of which affecting "food to the table" operations.
