My name is Jessica Nash, and I live in Salem, Oregon and/or I am writing on behalf of the farmworkers in Oregon, who have been historically mistreated

I am writing to you today in support of farmworker overtime. Farmworkers should receive overtime pay after 40 hours in a workweek at one and one-half times the employee's regular rate of pay.

Without farm workers, society would be unimaginable, and the fact that they do not receive the same respect and compensation as other workers in society is not right. California offers one of the most progressive laws, putting into effect overtime pay for farmers working more than 40 hours a week, implemented over a seven year process. Oregon, as a typically more progressive state than California should be doing better, and should choose a shorter timeline for overtime pay to be available for farmworkers. Overworking and underpaying our farm workers will only lead to a shortage of workers, which negatively affects the economy. There are negative economic effects, and personal effects that these families feel. While they are feeding tables across America, sometimes they are unable to afford to feed their own family with a median salary of \$28,000 per year. This median salary is one of the lowest across the country, and without proper compensation, workers will move to other states where they are more appreciated, leaving Oregon farms empty. The passing of these laws will create better lives for workers and their families, and keep jobs in Oregon.

I urge you to pass farmworker overtime in the 2022 Legislative Session to ensure farmworkers in Oregon are paid fairly for their skilled and essential labor.
