Re: SB 1574 - SAFE Kit

Chair Prozanski, Vice Chair Thatcher and members of the committee:

On behalf of Oregon's 62 community hospitals and the patients they serve, the Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems (OAHHS) supports SB 1574 and the -1 amendment. The bill with the -1 amendment is a legislative fix to the definition for sexual assault forensic evidence (SAFE) kit. We appreciate the Sexual Assault Task Forces work on this legislative fix and their overall collaborative nature with OAHHS and Oregon hospitals to ensure survivors of sexual assault get access to the best care and resources.

This legislative fix will ensure a copy of the Medical Forensic Examination Form is included in the SAFE kit, which is then transferred to law enforcement for storage and processing. SAFE Kits are stored for 60 years. Under current law, if the Medical Forensic Examination Form (form) is not included with the SAFE Kit, the form is only maintained for 7-10 years from the date of service. SB 1574 and the -1 Amendment will fix this current logistical flaw and ensure that forensic and written documentation are all included in the SAFE kit and preserved for 60 years. This would apply to all SAFE kits, including anonymous SAFE kits. The importance of the inclusion of the form is to ensure the SAFE kit is complete if a survivor decides to report to law enforcement after the time the hospital has purged its records and before the end of the 60 years, the SAFE kit will remain complete.

We support SB 1574 and the -1 amendment and appreciate the work that has gone into this legislation. Please join us and your community hospitals in supporting the bill.
