

SafeSpace Facility Investment: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

SERVING OREGON'S GILLIAM, HOOD RIVER, WASCO, and WHEELER COUNTIES



In the Columbia Gorge region, approximately

1,500 children per year will likely experience child abuse.





Purpose

A permanent child abuse assessment facility is needed to provide best-practice response to children showing signs of child abuse in the Columbia Gorge region. The Hood River-based SafeSpace facility will serve Oregon's children in Gilliam, Hood River, Wasco, and Wheeler Counties.

Need

In the Columbia Gorge region, approximately 1,500 children per year will likely experience child abuse, based on CDC estimates (1 in 7 children). SafeSpace anticipates 320 cases will require the expertise in forensic interviewing and medical examination uniquely provided by a CAC (Child Advocacy Center). Most Oregon regions have a permanent CAC facility; the Columbia Gorge region does not.

Urgency

COVID-19 has increased insecurity in families and isolated children in places where they are more vulnerable to abuse. We anticipate an increase and intensity of child abuse cases that will require the expertise and intervention of SafeSpace for years to come. Every effort must be made to increase response time to signs of abuse and ensure access to best practice community response.

Inclusion

The SafeSpace Facility will be equally accessible and responsive to children from diverse family backgrounds. According to census data, Latinx families constitute 32% of Hood River County's population, and 20% of nearby Wasco County. The planned new facility will support a needed expansion of bilingual and culturally specific services.

Facility Plan

SafeSpace plans to purchase and renovate 4,000 sf of clinical space in Hood River. The facility will sustain support for 320 children per year who show signs of abuse.

Cost

\$2,000,000 supports purchase of an existing clinical facility, plus renovation, (hard and soft costs), contingency and reserve fund for maintenance. These costs have been vetted by a community-based facility team of realtors and developers.

Timing

With the requested investment, this project will be **completed during 2022-2023**.

Sustainability

Children's Advocacy Centers are sustainable with contract support and earned income. A strong base of community support will augment services.

Request

\$2,000,000 to fully fund the project. An additional \$500,000 will be raised from private sector donors to expand services in the new facility.
