Our choice was to pull from public school 2 blocks away, send them to private or home school them. I think that we need to choose what is best in each situation—especially if we have children with special needs because they do not fit the mold. Even children without special needs are special and need to be served in school to fit their own learning style or even to address medical and family needs to keep a family intact.
