HB 4034

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/11/2022 AGENDA: Deletes requirement that coordinated care organization collect specified data from members and submit data to Oregon Health Authority.

HB 4035

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/11/2022 AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations for options to improve access to or lower cost of health care in Oregon.

HB 4109

HB 4081

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/11/2022 AGENDA: Requires pharmacist who dispenses opioid prescription to offer prescription for naloxone, or similar drug, and information about naloxone under specified circumstances.

HB 4083

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/11/2022 AGENDA: Requires individual and group health insurance policies, health care service contractors, multiple employer welfare arrangements and state medical assistance program to provide reimbursement for at least three primary care visits annually in addition to one annual preventive primary care visit covered without cost-sharing.

HB 4134

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/11/2022 AGENDA: Requires insurer and health care service contractor to cover labor and delivery services provided at out-of-network health care facility if services provided at out-of-network facility due solely to diversion of patient from in-network health care facility for reasons related to state or federal declaration of public health emergency.
