**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 1522**

1 On page 2 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, after “ORS” delete the  
2 rest of the line and lines 3 and 4 and insert “336.035; and prescribing an ef-  
3 fective date.”.

4 Delete lines 6 through 45 and delete pages 3 through 36 and insert:

5 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 336.035 is amended to read:

6 “336.035. (1)(a) [*The*] **A** district school board shall [*see*] **ensure** that the  
7 courses of study prescribed by law and by the rules of the State Board of  
8 Education are carried out.

9 “(b) [*The*] **A** district school board may establish supplemental courses  
10 that are not inconsistent with the prescribed courses and may adopt courses  
11 of study in lieu of state courses of study upon approval by the Superinten-  
12 dent of Public Instruction.

13 “(c) **For each course of study offered by the school district, the**  
14 **district school board shall ensure that the curriculum of the course is**  
15 **made available to the public on the school district’s website.**

16 “(2) Any district school board may establish a course of education con-  
17 cerning sexually transmitted infections including recognition of causes,  
18 sources and symptoms, and the availability of diagnostic and treatment cen-  
19 ters. Any such course established may be taught to adults from the commu-  
20 nity served by the individual schools as well as to students enrolled in the  
21 school. The board shall cause the parents or guardians of minor students

1 to be notified in advance that the course is to be taught. Any such parent  
2 or guardian may direct in writing that the minor child in the care of the  
3 parent or guardian be excused from any class within the course. Any parent  
4 or guardian may inspect the instructional materials to be used before or  
5 during the time the course is taught.

6 “(3) The district school board shall coordinate the course provided in  
7 subsection (2) of this section with the officials of the local health department  
8 and the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Teachers holding endorsements  
9 for health education shall be used where available. A teacher may not be  
10 subject to discipline or removal for teaching or refusing to teach courses  
11 concerning sexually transmitted infections.

12 **“SECTION 2. (1) A school district must first comply with the re-**  
13 **quirements of ORS 336.035, as amended by section 1 of this 2022 Act,**  
14 **no later than July 1, 2022.**

15 **“(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, if a school dis-**  
16 **trict has an average daily membership of 10,000 or less, the school**  
17 **district is not required to first comply with the requirements of ORS**  
18 **336.035, as amended by section 1 of this 2022 Act, until July 1, 2023.**

19 **“SECTION 3. This 2022 Act takes effect on July 1, 2022.”.**

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
