I am proud to say that Oregon has some of the finest nurses in the country, but the reality is that we need more, and we will need to continue to grow that specific workforce for years to come as we try to keep up with the greater medical needs of our communities. Nurses are at the heart of our healthcare system. An increase in opportunities for people to pursue nursing and a continued commitment to funding a well-trained nurse workforce has a direct impact on ambulance and EMS providers like Mercy Flights.

Mercy Flights relies heavily on our flight nurses to provide outstanding care. These nurses are chosen from the best group of available nurses possible, given the unique nature of their responsibilities. Furthermore, as our organization continues to broaden the scope of our mobile integrated health care services, we will seek nurses to complement our advanced trained paramedics to provide health care within patients' homes which improves access to affordable healthcare, especially to our most vulnerable populations. Supporting a nursing workforce that supports our organization and our community makes sense for Mercy Flights, and it is my hope that all Oregonians can see the impact that a strong nursing workforce can have on all of us.
