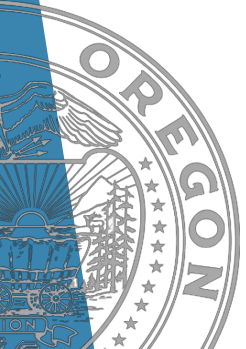

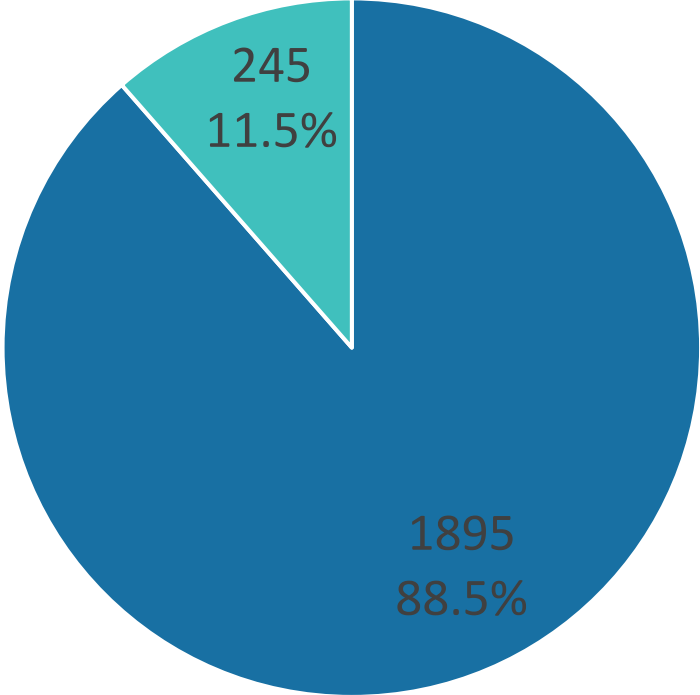
EIS Organizational Structure



Oregon IT Organizational Structure

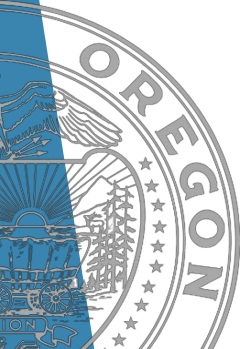


Classified IT Positions Spread Across 47 Agencies

Redundant tools and structures

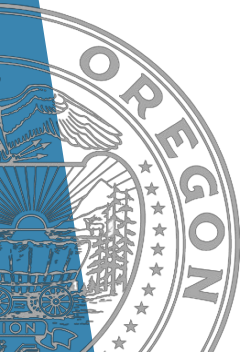
Missed efficiencies with utilization of resources and assets
