To the Oregon State Lawmakers,

I am writing in support of rescinding Measure 110.

The legal component of the law, regarding small amounts of drugs, both encourages addiction and gives agency to the addicts and the dealers on the street. The dealers and cartels have won. Our cities and communities have lost. We've lost in quality of life outside our doors and in our public spaces. We've lost by having to watch our fellow citizens turn into meth and fentanyl zombies on the sidewalk.
