What do you want to tell legislators about the proposed \$1.9 Billion Rose Quarter Freeway Expansion and Oregon's transportation system?

I moved to Oregon from Texas not only to escape right-wing legislature, but to also live in a walkable, accessible neighborhood, of which Portland has many more options than Austin. I feel safe walking biking, and even driving on smaller streets, and it makes me feel more like part of a community. Please demand an Environmental Impact Statement and direct ODOT to prioritize investment in our public transit, increasing bike and pedestrian safety, and preserving the sanctity of this historical black neighborhood.
