What do you want to tell legislators about the proposed \$1.9 Billion Rose Quarter Freeway Expansion and Oregon's transportation system?

To members of the Joint Special Subcommittee on Transportation Planning – I am writing to ask you to require, on behalf of concerned parents everywhere, that ODOT conduct and Environmental Impact Statement on their actual plan for the Rose Quarter. We need transparency about what the impact of this work will be, in terms of emissions, particulate matter, noise, and vehicles moving at high speeds through the center of our city.

I think it is important to right past wrongs by restoring the Albina neighborhood, but I do not believe that any expansion of the freeway itself is a wise, prudent, or good decision.
