

My nephew at 27 years old is dead. He suffered from drug addiction and mental health issues.

Before measure 110 passed he would often get arrested for theft, possession, indecent public behavior etc. Once in jail he would be admitted for mental health evaluation and help. During these times he got the help (medication) he needed and would stay clean and sober for a time.

Unfortunately he did return to drugs, but each time he got and stayed clean was a step closer to full recovery.

After measure 110 passed he no longer was held accountable, he was on the streets for prolonged periods of time. Three of his toes had to be amputated because of frost bite and he could no longer walk properly.

Never again was he arrested if he was, he was immediately released with no consequences or help as before.

He died alone in a park, overdosed under a tree. He was emsnciated from lack of food. Measure 110 helped my young nephew to his death.

Measure 110 is helping no one. It is enabling addicts to continue a lifestyle that will kill them.

I'm disgusted and sickened by Oregonian leaders who wrote a bill that misled the voters into voting for something so disastrous.

Measure 110 must be repealed, had it never passed my nephew may still be alive.
