In 2018, when I first heard about measure 110 my instant thoughts were, "well that's not going to end well" as my family and I were packing up and moving to Idaho.

A series of unfortunate events led us back to Oregon in 2020. Right when the plandemic started. The amount of people on the streets had increased to an alarming rate. People started openly using drugs...how could this have happened in such a short amount of time?!

As voters we were falsely promised that there would be treatment programs that anyone could go to whenever they decided it was time to get off the drugs. Yet here we are in 2023, struggling to find resources for any treatment of addiction. Yet these people have full blown access to fresh, clean needles and crack pipes! Do any of you realize how awful the state of Portland is??

Do any of you care that so many people die in the streets of Portland everyday! To the point where citizens are now having to help bring people back to life!
