Monday's hearing confirmed that Measure 110 has FAILED!!! Our communities need real solutions, real safety, and real healing when it comes to addressing the overdose and addiction crisis and a total revamp of the FAILED Measure 110 and some forms of penalties to those who mis-use drugs.

I am submitting a public comment to show support for putting penalties back in place in Oregon. Those who advocate for a continuation of the statis quo, such as "Oregon Health Justice Recovery Alliance" are people who are using M110 simply to fund themselves and put money in their own pockets. Please don't listen to them, or at the least do research on who runs these programs and you will find that many have been criminals in the past that is simply using the state now for their own gains.

The situation is urgent and we need action. While M110 was a noble idea, it has failed, miserably, for there are no repercussions for those caught with drugs, they are simply turned loose as long as they say they will make a phone call, which most do not.
