# Medicaid Waiver — Carceral Capacity Building & Limited OHP Benefits

- OHA has requested CMS waive approval to provide limited OHP benefits to eligible youth and adults incarcerated in state, county, and regional facilities up to 90 days pre-release.
  - Limited benefits include: medication for substance use treatment (MAT), care coordination/case management, limited clinical services, and prescription drugs including Rx in-hand at release.
    - > \$5.2M Total Funds (\$1.4M General Fund, \$3.9M Federal Funds)
- OHA is also seeking CMS approval for one-time capacity building in carceral settings.
  - > \$115.5M via 50% federal match and 50% DSHP revenue



# **OHA Overall Budget Risks**

- ✓ Oregon Health Plan caseload changes as OHA continues to reinstitute redeterminations.
- ✓ The FEMA reimbursement process is slow and there is a
  risk FEMA will deny some expenditures as not eligible.
- ✓ Oregon State Hospital budget issues remain related to staffing costs, workplace violence mitigation and safety costs, and revenue collection.
