The Problem

Decade of rate cuts = depleted workforce

Complex regulatory framework

Needless duplicative systems / silos too many agencies with too many duplicative contract requirements, audits, reviews, reports

Episodic system creates <u>gaps</u> in service (i.e. <u>added trauma</u>) for youth and families.


Gaps (and what come after) are: bad, re-traumatize the youth, start from scratch, lose progress, generate mistrust and fear.

Gaps in service = increased trauma & loss of progress

Closure of major programs:

The "I Am" program for black teen boys (OYA)

The "White Shield" program for pregnant/parenting girls

The Bob Belloni Ranch Girls program

Boys & Girls Aid "Nest" for girls 10-under

As a result....

Families with no support feel abandoned when youth come home

Children see dozens of different adults, over and over

Youth move into higher and higher levels of care

Staff become frustrated by dysfunctional system

State pays higher and higher costs as youth age

Opportunity for true progress is lost
