SYSTEM OF CARE ADVISORY COUNCIL

- SOCAC was established by SB 1 in 2019 to act as a central, impartial forum for statewide policy development, funding strategy recommendations and planning. The council's goal is to improve the effectiveness and efficacy of child-serving state agencies and the continuum of care that provides services to youth (ages 0-25).
- Four pillars: Youth & Family centered, integrated systems, culturally & linguistically responsive, community-based services

SITUATION:

Substance use disorder treatment funding is not specifically allocated for youth in MI 10, Opioid Settlement, or other funding streams.

SITUATION

- Youth and children's SUD treatment services come from a siloed and splintered system
- Adult SUD treatment services are centrally managed by OHA via contracts, but the service environment for youth and children is inconsistent, confusing, and hard to access for youth in need of care and treatment

SOCAC RECOMMENDATIONS

- First, understand what we have and what we need
 - Assessments are underway and building upon previously completed work
 - What do we have, what do we need, and where do we need to build it
 - Then, ADPC and SOCAC can work together to build a youth substance use treatment strategic plan
