




Healthier Oregon and Community Partner impact

Healthier Oregon Grantee Partners

25 Healthier Oregon grantee organizations (2023-2025 biennium)

- Total funding: \$4.5M
- Grant awards range from \$50,000 to \$300,000



Technical Assistance provided to grantees

- Community Health Worker training provided to Community Partner and Healthier Oregon grantees free of cost as part of technical assistance.
- Optional Ambassadors Program for Healthier Oregon grantees. (Available to any Healthier Oregon Grantees who have not yet participated)

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Equitable Access to Care

- Community Partner success in Cover All Kids enrollment did not lead to equitable access to OHP covered services.
- Healthier Oregon program using health navigation grants through community partners to connect individuals enrolled to:
 - understand their new benefits and how to use their benefits,
 - \circ connect with their CCO,
 - understand rights and benefits and
 - triage and escalate needs that need community, CCO or OHA attention.



- Welcome center: helps people newly arriving in Oregon connect with health coverage & other resources.
- Partnership with Mexican Consulate: Spanish TV, Radio and Facebook <u>ads</u>.
- OSU program evaluation and <u>report</u>.

System Improvement Opportunities

- Healthier Oregon grantees triage and escalate needs that need community, CCO or OHA attention.
- Essential partnership with CCOs

 Community Partner Connects
- Opportunity for OHA and CCOs to make OHA's health equity <u>definition</u> operational
- Opportunity for OHA to work closely with CCOs for critical equity-centered care coordination & systems improvement.
