Requirements of HB 2930 (2021)

Commission Membership

- 15 Members
- Co-chaired by Attorney General and Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training
- Member of the Senate and House of Representatives (Non-voting)

Categories of Misconduct:

- Unjustified or excessive use of physical or deadly force
- Sexual harassment
- Sexual assault
- Assault
- Conduct that is motivated by or based on a real or perceived factor of an individual's race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion or homelessness;
- Moral character
- The use of drugs or alcohol while on duty

• Deadlines:

- Report to House Judiciary Committee (September 1, 2022)
- Adopt uniform standards (October 1, 2022)

Moral Character

- Definition: "Moral Character" means performing the duties of a law enforcement officer in a manner that demonstrates honesty, fairness, and respect for the rights of others and for the laws of the state and the nation.
- Includes:
 - Conduct constituting a felony under state or federal law; domestic violence; stalking; a drug-related offense, except for offenses involving use or possession of marijuana; a bias or hate crime; or a sex crime
- Untruthfulness
- Misuse of Authority for Financial Gain
