Legislative History

- HB 2842 (2021) established the program with \$10 million funding, 3.5 FTE
 - Provide grants to eligible entities to improve housing conditions for low-income and environmental justice communities
- SB 1536 (2022) added \$5 million and additional eligible recipients and uses
- HB 2987 (2024) appropriated an additional \$15 million
 - Provided OHA the flexibility to fund applicants at the full amount requested as opposed to negotiating reduced funding
 - Allowed OHA to double funding to 9 Federally Recognized Tribes in Oregon
 - From \$1.5 million to \$3 million (10% of total funding)
 - Non-competitive set aside (not part of the Request For Grant Application (RFGA) process)



Updated Allocation Plan for \$30 Million Funding

- \$3 million in non-competitive funding offered to the nine Federally Recognized Tribes in Oregon
- \$20 million available to fund approximately 30 grantees at or close to their full request levels in the initial round of grantmaking
- \$5 million holdback for future round of funding to address gaps (e.g., geographic, culturally specific) or support capacity development
- \$2 million to cover program staff and expenses over the next 3 years of administering grants.



Funding Priorities Aligned With Statute

- Organizations experienced in maximizing energy efficiency, extending the usable life of homes, or improving the health or safety of occupants of residences, which serve eligible households in Oregon
- Proposals demonstrating evidence-based activities which are intended to improve the health and safety of residents
- Organizations serving historically unrepresented and underserved communities including People of color, low-income, and American Indian and Alaska Native communities.
- Applicants using funds to bridge gaps and leverage funding streams from other sources

Grantmaking Timeline

- February 8, 2024 Request for grant application released
- April 9 RFGA Closed
- May Applications reviewed
- June Review continues; final award decisions made
- July Notifications to applicants; grant agreements executed
- August Funding distributed to successful applicants




Overview of RFGA Applicants

- Manufactured dwelling park nonprofit cooperative- 0
- Natural gas utility- **0**

RFGA Review Process

- Review Panel Members: OHA, Departments of Energy, Housing & Community Services, Education
- Each application reviewed/scored by three panelists
- Final awardees will be selected by:
 - Quality and completeness of application
 - Geographic area covered
 - Community served
