First Principals First: We all love Oregon..

- ✓ It's uniquely beautiful.
- ✓ It has a rich history and a tremendous diversity of people, cultures, communities and businesses.
- ✓ Yes, we are often passive aggressive... but at least we have polite drivers. ©

But Oregon is struggling.

- Significant increase in tax burdens.
- Stagnant population growth.
- National reputation.
- Poor business and regulatory climate rankings.
- High cost of living and low housing affordability.
- State spending growth outpacing GDP growth.
- Lackluster results for state spending.



Loss of competitive footing.

- Oregon's business tax burden increased by more than 40% since 2019 Ernst & Young
- Portland has second highest marginal income rate in nation Ernst & Young
- Portland area businesses have experienced 32% increase in local taxes since
 2019 Ernst & Young
- Oregon's business tax burden higher than most peer states, including Washington, Idaho and California — Ernst & Young
- Oregon has gone from business tax climate of 9^{th} in 2014, to 24^{th} in $2024 \tau_{ax}$
- Oregon's corporate tax rank went from 30th in 2014 to 49th in 2024 ταχ Foundation



2024 Oregon Competitiveness "Red Book"

- Oregon ranks 6th in quality of life, but 48th in cost of living *cnbc*
- Oregon ranks 2nd in unemployment taxes as % of wages *us Dept of Labor*
- Oregon ranks 8th in both industrial and residential energy costs, and 7th in commercial energy costs – us Dept of Energy
- Oregon ranks 41st in business openings and 11th in business closings *us Bureau* of Labor Statistics
- Oregon ranks 41st in home ownership *us census Bureau*. While Metro area ranks 11th in home cost relative to income *Harvard/Joint Center for Housing Studies*
- Portland ranks 1st in effective property tax rate on primary residence in state's largest city *Lincoln Institute of Land Policy*

We can no longer rely on "but it's a great place to live."



So, what have we done about it?

For more than 40 years we've said 'NO'

- No anti-business laws
- No overburdensome regulations
- No more taxes
- No anti-business candidates or ballot measures
